# Daily Reading & Homework

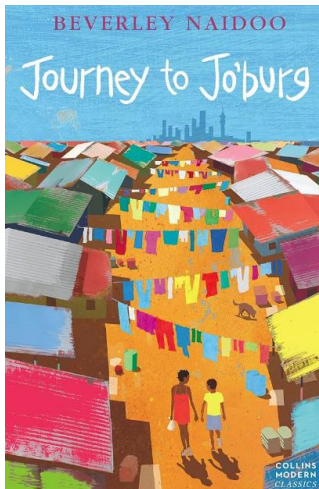


- Your child must bring in their book bag every day.

  - English homework is grammar focussed using <https://www.spagtastic.com/>

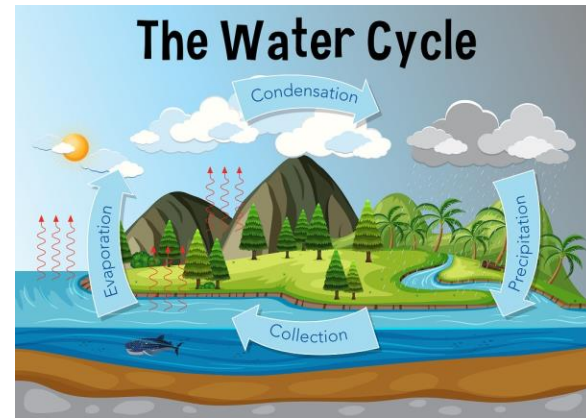
# ENGLISH

First person diary entry and poetry based

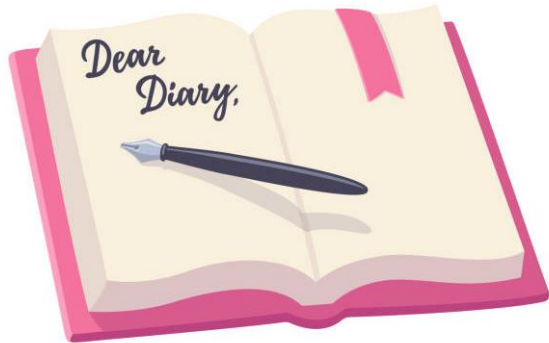

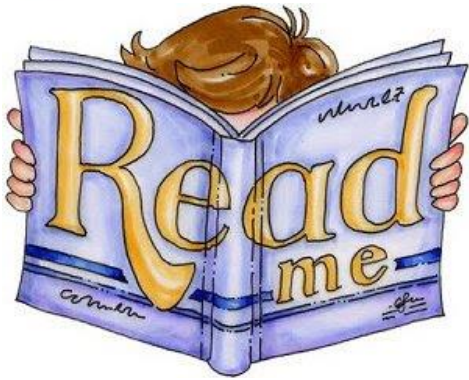




# FUN ENGLISH ACTIVITIES AT HOME

Add and subtract fractions with the same denominator (*using diagrams*)

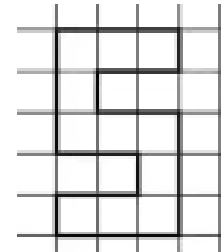
Solve simple measure and money problems involving fractions and decimals to two decimal places

Recognise and write decimal equivalents of any number of tenths or hundredths

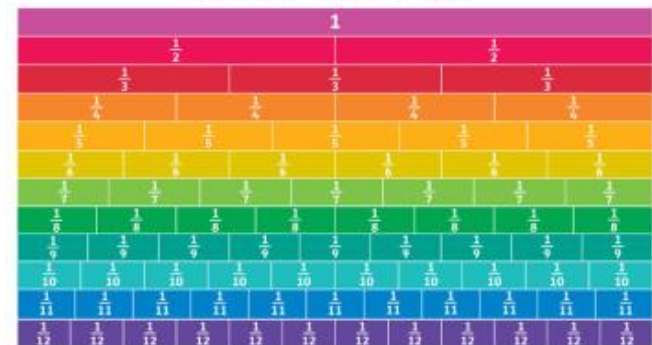
Recognise and write decimal equivalents to  $\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\frac{1}{2}$ ,  $\frac{3}{4}$

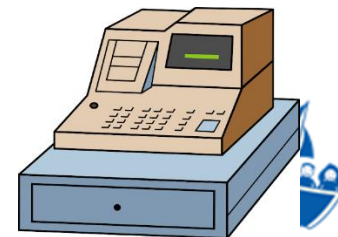

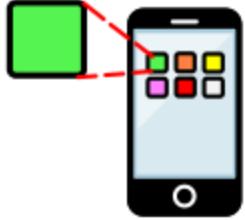
