Children at Cyril Jackson Primary have been selected for a new learning service which brings the curriculum to life through “immersive educational workshops”.

The now-press-play service was launched with a workshop at the Limehouse school in Three Colt Street when the children put on wireless headphones and were plunged into the world of their topic.

“They became immersed in sound as a character in a story,”

the school’s newsletter explains.

“They were discovering places and solving problems on an educational adventure they will never forget, whether bouncing across the surface of Mars, plunging into the digestive system or travelling faster than the speed of light!”

### Access

Cyril Jackson was chosen as a lead school for the scheme, which gives them unlimited access to a library of experi-

ences, with their own headphones and equipment, as well as special staff training. Meanwhile, the school has launched its online CJ Newsmail where parents can subscribe to receive selected newsletters.

The school promises to not share email addresses and parents can unsubscribe at any time. But the main communication channel is still old-fashioned printed letters sent home with pupils, parents are assured.
